

# CRESCENT SCHOOL NEWSLETTER

#### Dear Parents/Guardians

We have been joined by new students this term and we would like to warmly welcome them and their parents to Crescent School and hope they settle in as quickly as possible and are made to feel at home.

With teamwork and perseverance Crescent School was able to implement its Covid 19 Compliance Plan and open for Second Term 2020. This was no easy feat and would not have been possible had it not been for the support of the parent body and the Lobatse Community. On behalf of all the staff at Crescent School we are very grateful for your support and will show our gratitude by making sure that your children are well cared for and kept as safe as possible at school as we continue with the coverage of all curriculums and the pursuit of excellence. I extend my gratitude to the former School Head, Mr. Ramasamy, who provided guidance and technical assistance as we worked to make our school compliant with MOBE Covid 19 guidelines. We will continue to ensure that our Covid 19 Protocols are implemented as the term progresses and improve on them where need be.

# **Covid 19 Protocols**

I am pleased to report that so far all our procedures are working well and that our students are adhering to them. Even our little ones are able to keep their masks on and practice social distancing most of the time. We have orientated them on coughing and sneezing etiquette. We are encouraging students to wash hands more than sanitize as this is more effective and healthier over the long run. We continue to provide sanitizer so that books and stationery can be disinfected. We have purchased urns so that warm water is provided and there are soap and paper towels available.

The cleaners wipe down all surfaces in classrooms and mop floors with disinfectant on a daily basis. Door handles are being wiped. Toilets are thoroughly cleaned twice a day and this is being monitored by SHE teachers, management and the support staff supervisor who monitor that there is always soap and paper towels and that waste bins are emptied. The used paper towels are being treated as clinical waste and are stored separately from other waste. The groundsmen spray disinfectant on the fences, stair rails and outdoor areas once students dismiss. Social distancing is being monitored by teachers. Desks have been spaced in classes. When the weather permits primary students are taken out onto the field for physical exercise whilst observing social distancing. This allows them some time to get fresh air and to stretch. Some students are getting a little frustrated with always having to wear a mask and the lack of physical contact with their peers. Please help us by encouraging them at home to keep corona safe. It is also important that masks are washed daily and where possible even uniforms.

Until further notice the following applies.


- The tuckshop remains closed. Please pack healthy food for your children.

- All school trips are suspended.


Please do not send your child to school if he/she is not feeling well. Please collect your children on time. If we keep taking preventative precautions we will get through this pandemic.


#### **Teachers on Duty**

# Revised Year Calendar for 2020.

Attached is a revised calendar for 2020. The closing date for students in third term at the end of the school year is different for secondary and primary because of the staggered opening for this term. #### Uniform

The winter school uniform is the same as the summer school uniform; however, some additional items of clothing can be worn during the second term. Those are:

Boys - "V" neck blue jersey or full track suit (top and bottom), navy blue gloves and a blue woolen hat, a navy blue rain coat or jacket.

Girls - Navy blue button up cardigan or full track suit (top and bottom) or dress and navy blue pantyhose, navy blue gloves and navy blue hat, a navy blue rain coat or jacket.
